
ergetic performance of between eight to ten songs was enough to establish Hallowmas as the darkest outfit of the night.

Pittsburgh have a brash, modern rock/punk sound. Their alternating vocals and chanting choruses grab your attention and envelop you in a melodically layered waterfall of distorted guitars and bass lines.

Supplied by a Gibson SG and Fender strats, their sound has an edge to it reminiscent of the 60's Stones, mixed with the pulse of Sonic Youth. With band members having played around town for almost two decades, their experience as a professional stage act is conspicuous, yet confined. Definitely check 'em out next time.





The Legendary Hucklebuck's reputation as a high adrenaline rockabilly act is an accurate description. As soon as they hit the stage as the night's third performance, the empty floor in front filled up quickly with patrons ready to be rocked.

The Hucklebucks are something to see. Trucker rock blended with a Dick Dale quick pickin' style, the boom of a stand-up bass, spot on drumming and an insane singer, these guys attract a crowd everywhere they play.
